Much has happened in 2016. In Ntulele, an outer area of Oloonkolin, clean drinking water has been realized. A borehole has been installed, a water tank has been built and a water pipe has also been connected to the school where a water kiosk has been constructed. Girls will no longer be forced to walk long distances to collect water from the river which is teeming with bacteria and dangerous wildlife. Instead, these girls can go to the school to collect clean water and follow lessons. This also provides parents with more time to work at home and to generate income.

In March of 2016, Chantal Westerhoff-De Ruiter, registered nurse based in the Netherlands, led a programme aimed at providing the residents of Oloonkolin with proper hygiene education. Chantal provided training to 15 local instructors who now distribute knowledge of proper hygiene amongst the local population. Education has already been provided to 1500 children and adults. The aim is to reach 5000 Oloonkolin residents by the end of 2017.

Together with Chantal, a medical team including two optometrists from Stichting SLAH travelled to Oloonkolin on 4 March 2016. Their visit was dedicated to providing specialized eye care with several local specialists from the Trans Mara West Hospital - the nearest hospital located in Kilgoris, 70 km from Oloonkolin. In total, 400 people were screened; 140 were admitted for treatment, 78 of which received operations: 76 mature cataracts and 2 cornea punctures with a 99% post-operative success rate.

In collaboration with Stichting Help Verloskundigen in Kenya and Wilde Ganzen, local student Leina has been provided with midwife training since October of 2016. Following her education, she will provide women in Oloonkolin with guidance during pregnancy and childbirth. This will drastically reduce the death rate of women and new-borns. Leina is doing very well and is currently top of her class.

Another school in Oloonkolin recently suffered damage to the lavatory building and does not yet have access to clean drinking water. The government plans on closing the school leaving 400 children without education. In 2017, we will commit to rebuilding the lavatory building so that these children can continue their education. We will also ensure that these children have access to clean drinking water with the installation of water facilities at the school.

Quality healthcare is essential in Oloonkolin. We will direct efforts at providing the residents of Oloonkolin with access to medication, vaccinations and increased health and hygiene knowledge with the construction of a primary healthcare centre in Oloonkolin. This will result in a drastically reduced death toll and a large improvement to the quality of healthcare for the population. This will also affect Oloonkolin's economy and community. Unnecessary school/work absence due to illness will be reduced. Healthy individuals can contribute to the community and be employed in agriculture, businesses, hospitals and schools.

In 2017, we will also construct additional sanitary facilities .

We wouldn't have come this far without the help and support of many individuals, businesses, schools and foundations. We sincerely thank all of you who have supported and encouraged us.
